Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeon

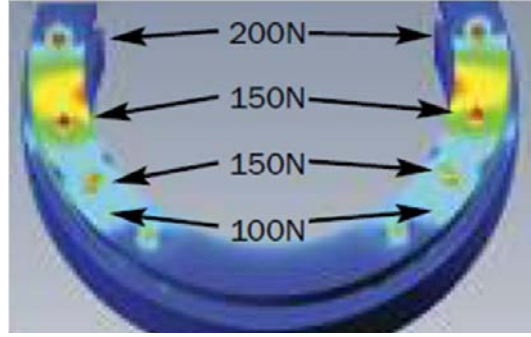
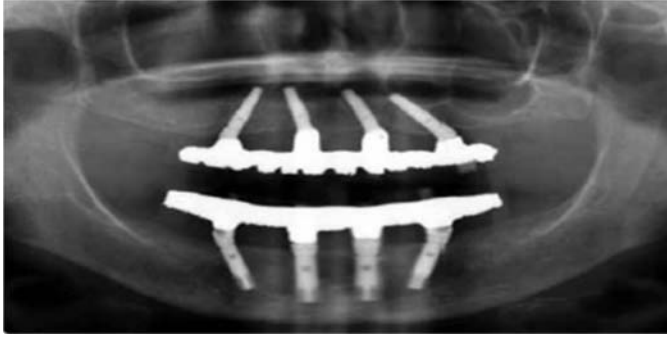

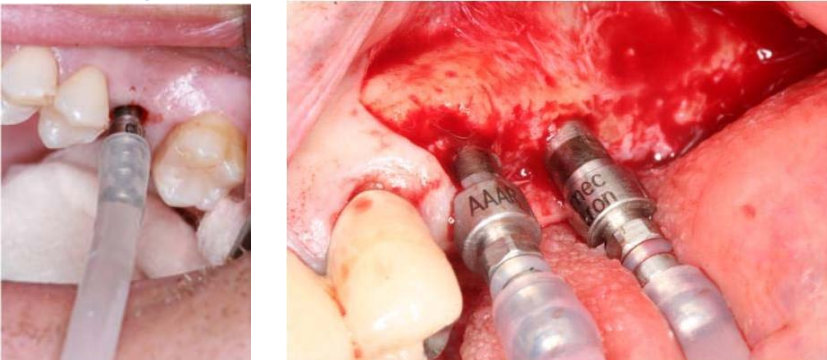
