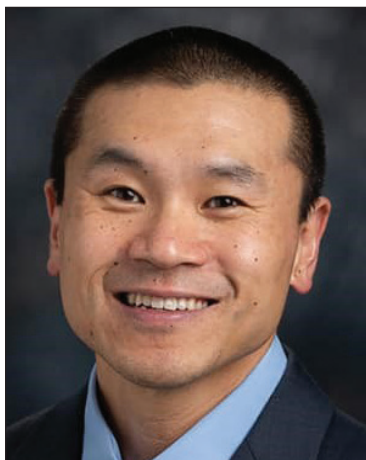

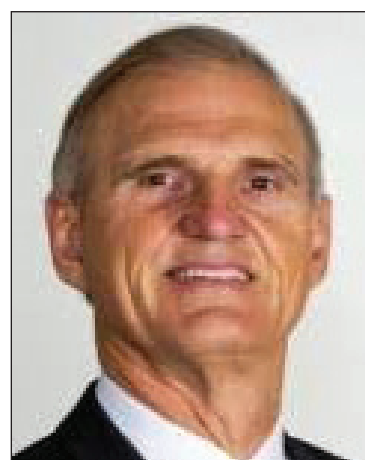

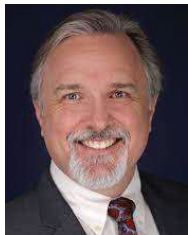

Dr Polido is Clinical Professor for the OMS Program at the Indiana University School of Dentistry. He is Co-Director of the Center for Implant, Esthetic and Innovative Dentistry and Pre-Doctoral Program at IUSD. He received his dental degree, master's and doctoral degrees in OMS from the PUCRS School of Dentistry in Porto Alegre, Brazil. He completed an OMS residency at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center. Dr Polido specializes in digital planning tools for implant dentistry and orthognathic surgery. He is a reviewer for OMFS and Implant Dentistry main journals.

Michael Gunson DDS MD • Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeon

Out in Front of Esthetic Dentistry – The Lips



Dr Gunson is a board-certified oral and maxillofacial surgeon and practices in Santa Barbara. He graduated from UCLA Dental School and Medical School and received his specialty certificate in oral and maxillofacial surgery from UCLA. Dr Gunson partnered with Dr G. William Arnett at the Center for Corrective Jaw Surgery in Santa Barbara. Their surgical practice has always been limited to diagnosing and treating facial growth problems by performing corrective jaw surgeries.

Synopsis

The lips are first and the center of facial development, have the most sensory and proprioceptive fibers of any facial structure and are preeminently responsible for all the basic facial functions: breathing, eating, communicating, and attraction. The focus of esthetic dentistry is the form, position, and appearance of the anterior dentition. So, what effect do the teeth have on lip esthetics and function? And when we change tooth positions and forms are we working with nature for a beneficial, healthy, and esthetic effect? This lecture will discuss the purpose and function of the lips and how the teeth influence them, positively and negatively. Dental restorative, orthodontic, and surgical treatment strategies that maximize lip esthetic and function will be presented.
